arsonist	the malicious burning of another's house or property.
burglar	the felony of breaking into and entering the house of another with intent to steal.
criminal	a person who is involved in an action or an instance of negligence that is deemed injurious to the public welfare or morals or to the interests of the state and that is legally prohibited.
hazard	an unavoidable danger or risk, even though often foreseeable.
natural disaster	an event such as a flood, earthquake, or hurricane that causes great damage or loss of life.
OSHA	the division of the Department of Labor that sets and enforces occupational health and safety rules.
security	freedom from danger, risk, etc.; safety.
terrorist	a person who uses violence and threats to intimidate or coerce, especially for political purposes.
thief	a person who steals, especially secretly or without open force.
threat	a declaration of an intention or determination to inflict punishment, injury, etc., in retaliation for, or conditionally upon, some action or course.
